


BACS SUPPORTING MATERIALS



The resources channel of the site contains an FAQ section covering multiple topics and the services channel has a whole area dedicated to providing operational information.


In addition, the website contains a packed document library, its contents ranging from best practice tips for using Direct Debit and Bacs Direct Credit to details about their operational use.





GUIDES AND RULES MICROSITES

The Direct Debit and Bacs Direct Credit Guide and Rules govern how organisations should operate Direct Debit and Bacs Direct Credit. They are divided into sections taking you on a journey through the different stages you might encounter when operating them.

Each section is designed to help you easily identify what is a rule (something that must be done) and what is guidance (a best practice suggestion).




ECOMMS PROGRAMME

We run a comprehensive eComms programme, regularly sending out operational news and updates to a variety of audiences including businesses, bureaux and payment service providers.

People at organisations using the Bacs Payment System who are listed as primary security contacts (PSCs) will automatically receive a copy of the eComms. Anyone else who is eligible for access to the password protected area of bacs.co.uk can also sign up to receive this eComms when they register for password protected area to the site.

In addition we have other publicly available communications that you may sign-up to receive. You can choose to be notified when press releases become available or receive notification when new articles are posted to Bacs Briefing in the News Channel of bacs.co.uk, an area where we share news and views about Bacs services and the wider payments industry.

BACS ELEARNING

Organisations moving from paper to paperless Direct Debit are required to take the *Introduction to paperless Direct Debit* course.


